On behalf of the Champaign County Libertarian Central Committee I would like to thank you for your service as a public official. This has been a tough year with the Coronavirus pandemic but we appreciate the work you are doing to facilitate Municipal Elections.

I am writing to inform you that the Libertarian Party attained Established Party Status in Illinois House of Representatives District 103 thanks to the number of ballots our candidate received in that race.

According to the Illinois Compiled Statutes 10 ILCS 5 Election Code. Section 10-2:

"A political party which, at the last election in any congressional district, legislative district, county, township, municipality or other political subdivision or district in the State, polled more than 5% of the entire vote cast within such territorial area or political subdivision, as the case may be, has voted as a unit for the election of officers to serve the respective territorial area of such district or political subdivision, is hereby declared to be an "established political party" within the meaning of this Article as to such district or political subdivision."

Since Urbana Ward 1 is entirely within the territorial area of District 103 we are now an established party for that district. As a member of this established party, I am submitting a petition to run as a Libertarian in the 2021 Municipal Primary Election.
