As I have gotten older, I have realized that life is short and the things that I have started to appreciate are some of the same things I took for granted when I was younger. One of those things has been time. Another is purpose. When I was younger, I did not value my time because I thought because I was young I had so much of it left. And as far as purpose. I felt like there was plenty of time to figure that out as well. Following the famous advice of grandmothers everywhere, I kept on living and realized, especially in this past month you never know how much time you actually have, and because of that, you should cherish each moment that you have doing what you love to do, with those you love, and walking in the purpose you were created to walk in. I have come to realize that my purpose. Was to be a voice for the voiceless. To be an advocate for those who either lack the ability or the know-how to advocate for themselves.

The way that I chose to live out this purpose was by joining the Champaign Unit Four school board. First in 2011 and again in 2023. My first experience on the board was an extremely fulfilling one. There were many highs and lows knowing the decisions that I was making and the policies we were creating Were helping even the playing field for every young person who walked the halls of our many schools. After my first term, I dubbed my school board experience as the best thing that I never wanted to do. Unfortunately. This second time around, I cannot say I am having the same experience. This time around has been filled with mistrust, missteps, and misinformation. During this time the district and school board have taken much criticism over many topics from various stakeholders, some of it was warranted, some of it was not, and there's even some of it that was self-inflicted. Being the large public entity that we are, there are two things for certain. We are not going to always make the right call and even when we do, we will not always be able to please all of our constituents all the time. In both of those moments, we should always maintain a level of humility, compassion, and a willingness to adjust. It has become apparent that our current environment lacks these values.

Before rejoining the board, I had many conversations with individuals connected directly or indirectly to the school district. I heard about many great things that were happening in Unit 4. I also heard that there were challenges that were happening within the district and to the district. Armed with this information I jumped on board and worked my purpose once again in the district. Once inside I did notice the attacks that were happening to the district. However, what was more alarming to me were the self-inflicted wounds and attacks we were doing to ourselves.

I've tried to contribute to our district's progress through votes, conversations, and suggestions. However, given the current climate and culture, I no longer see a clear path forward. The District's decision not to maintain a level of humility, compassion, or adjustability has forced us to focus on adult-oriented issues instead of student-centered ones that can help raise our reading and math scores and comprehension. The ones that ensure that every child in our district is seen, heard, and respected, and the ones where we assess ourselves to make sure we have the right people in the right positions where they can thrive and, in turn, pass that along to our students.

So because of this, I no longer see the value of continuing in this capacity.

So please accept this as my resignation from the Champaign Unit Four Board of Education. Effective today at the conclusion of open session.

I understand this decision may disappoint some, and for that, I offer my sincere apologies. Having committed to a four-year term and leaving with less than a year in, I hope my prior contributions and dedication to our community will earn me the grace to understand the gravity of this decision, which was not made lightly but after months of contemplation.

Although I will no longer be sitting in this seat. I still stand true to my purpose and my commitment to my community and I pray that my future endeavors and works in this community will help me regain your support, trust, and faith. Thank you.
