On 12/25/2018 at approximately 2351 hours, METCAD dispatched UPD Officers to **Example**, in reference to a burglary in progress call. While en route, METCAD advised the reporting person stated she believed her neighbors were getting robbed. METCAD also advised two subjects wearing all black and one exited the house. METCAD further advised there was a vehicle parked in the street with the engine running and she believed her neighbors were out of town. METCAD also added that she saw a light cut on in one of the bedrooms and believed there was someone still inside.

Upon my arrival, I met with Officer Franqumont, who arrived at the same time, and began walking towards the residence. I noticed there was a dark color vehicle on the east side of the street that only had its parking lights on. The vehicle was parked near **section**. As we started approaching the vehicle, I unholstered my duty weapon and pointed it at the vehicle. I activated my weaponlight and saw a black male in the driver seat and a white female in the rear seat. I yelled "Police" and the vehicle drove away at a high rated speed north bound towards Stone Creek. I immediately informed the responding units that the vehicle was leaving via radio.

It should be noted, the vehicle, later determined to be a black BMW convertible IL registration of **sectors**, was stopped and officers had three individuals at gunpoint. See the other UPD Officers' report for further details.

Believing the reporting person possibly provided the wrong address since the vehicle was parked near **sector address**, Officer Franquemont and I began checking the residence. I held the front of the residence and Officer Franquemont held the rear. Shortly after, METCAD informed us the reporting person stated we were at the wrong address.

Officer Franquemont and I went to **second and he informed me** that he found an open door on the north west side of the residence. I then started requesting more officers to assist us with checking the residence. Shortly after, several UIPD Officers and CPD K9 Officer Kristensen arrived at the residence to assist us with searching the residence.

Officer Franquemont, Officer McKinney, UIPD Officer Tran, UIPD Officer Osterholt and I began checking the residence. In the living room on a couch, I located an individual underneath a blanket. I pointed my duty weapon at the individual and gave commands to show me their hands. A female uncovered herself and she identified herself as **Sector**. She explained to us that she reside in the residence. Around that time, METCAD checked the Champaign County Tax Assessor website and her name was listed as one of the homeowners. I informed the other officers inside and outside the residence that we were with the homeowners. I then reholsterd my duty weapon.

During my conversation with **second**, she stated her daughter, **second**, should be in her room asleep. Officer McKinney checked the room and she was not. I then learned **second** was inside the vehicle that was stopped. It was at that time, I gathered **second** snuck out of the residence and the reporting person saw her exiting the residence, which lead her to believe the residence was being burglarized. I explained to **second** on how the events of this call unfolded and what we learned as the call progressed. Afterwards, I spoke with Sergeant Mikalik on scene and explained what I had learned.

NARRATIVE			

On 12/25/2018 at approximately 2351 hours I responded to back officers on a possible burglary in progress at **Example 1**. While en route METCAD advised that a neighbor could see 2 subjects, dressed all in black, moving back and forth from the house to a vehicle that was parked on the street. The reporting person advised that she believed the owners of the home were out of town and she could now see "a light" going on in the house.

At about 2356 hours several officers began arriving on scene. Officers Gardner and Franquemont approached the residence on foot and advised they could see a vehicle parked on the east side of the street facing north. Sgt. McNaught, Officer Ruff, and I exited our squad cars at Stone Creek Boulevard and Stricker Lane and began walking towards the home. As we did I both heard and saw a vehicle in question accelerate and a very high rate of speed towards our location. I moved to the west curb as the car came closer. Sgt. McNaught, Officer Ruff, and I used our flash lights to illuminate the vehicle as I moved to the west curb behind the engine block of a squad car and drew my pistol. When the vehicle was about 50 feet away it came to an abrupt stop and I could see that there were three occupants - a male driver, a male backseat passenger, and a female backseat passenger.

When the vehicle stopped I pointed my pistol in the direction of the vehicle as Sgt. McNaught and Officer Ruff approached the vehicle from the passenger side. It should be noted that as the vehicle stopped I observed Officer Ruff run towards the front of the car. It appeared as though the vehicle lurched forward and Officer Ruff jumped up towards the hood of the car. When he did this I saw him fall forward, onto the hood of the car, and hit the windshield. I later learned that it was actually his pistol that contacted the windshield. When I examined the windshield after the incident I saw that it was broken at the point of impact and had "spider MIKALIK, ZACHE officer's initials_____approved________(UU1806270-#A1816210)

webbed" out approximately 12 inches in diameter.

I kept my pistol pointed at the vehicle as Officer Ruff walked towards the driver's side door and ordered the driver to exit the vehicle. When the door opened Officer Ruff grabbed the driver and pulled him out. The male lay face down on the ground next to the vehicle and was obeying all commands given to him.

I holstered my pistol and ordered the man to put his hands behind his back. He complied, and I put handcuffs on his wrists, checked them for proper fit, and double-locked them so they would not tighten. As I did this the male blurted out something to the effect of: "I'm so sorry I didn't know you guys were cops." I patted the man down and did not find any weapons, so I directed him to the backseat of the nearest squad car and secured him there. I walked back up to the stopped vehicle where Officer Ruff had the female passenger out and on the ground. She too was obeying all commands. I put handcuffs on her wrists, checked them for proper fit, and double-locked them so they would not tighten. I patted the female down and did not find any weapons so I directed her to the backseat of another squad car and had her secured in the backseat.

Once this was completed I returned to the vehicle and saw that Officer Jeffers, who had arrived to assist us, was escorting the male backseat passenger to a third squad car. Officer Jeffers began interviewing him and we soon learned that the two men in the car were visiting their friend, the female passenger, who lived at the house in question (

As he continued his interview I went to the home to speak with Officer McKinney, who had helped Officer Gardner check the interior of the residence to see if a burglary had actually occurred. Officer McKinney told me that they had located a male and female inside sleeping (the owners of the home). It was determined that their daughter, the female passenger in the car, had snuck out of the home without their knowledge and that was likely who the reporting person had seen. I relayed what I had learned to Sgt. McNaught and Officer Jeffers.

Just prior to officers arriving on scene, METCAD advised that believed that the neighbor was out of town and saw a light go on in a back room and thought it was possibly the master bedroom. Lastly, **Method** told METCAD that the vehicle was still running outside and she thought both subjects were inside the house.

Officer Gardner and Officer Franquemont were the first officers to arrive on scene and began approaching the vehicle from the north. Sgt. Mikalik, Officer Ruff and I arrived shortly thereafter and parked north of the residence near the intersection of Stricker Lane and East Stone Creek Boulevard. I observed that the vehicle was still parked near the house with the engine running and the parking lights on. Sgt. Mikalik began approaching the vehicle along the west side of Stricker Lane while Officer Ruff and I approached along the east side of Stricker Lane.

Officer Franquemont advised via radio that the vehicle was fleeing northbound and Officer Gardner added that he observed a black male and a white female in the car as it left at a high rate of speed.

I also heard and then saw the car accelerating at a high rate of speed toward our location with only the parking lights on. I remained in the yard of the 2300 block of Stricker Lane and began shining my flashlight at the car as it approached in hopes of getting the car to stop or at least get a visual of the occupants or the license plate. MCNAUGHT, TIMMYD officer's initials_____ approved _______(UU1806270-#A1816211) The vehicle, a black 2008 BMW convertible bearing registration **sectors**, then came to an abrupt stop directly in front of us. Officer Ruff and I approached the car with our duty weapons drawn and began ordering the occupants of the vehicle to show us our hands. I observed that there was no one in the front passenger seat and a black male was seated in the rear passenger seat.

I continued to point my weapon at this black male, later to be identified as , and complied by placing his hands outside the passenger window. I instructed to exit the car, but he said that he could not because he was in the backseat so I opened the passenger door and flipped forward the front seat allowing to continued to be very compliant and slowly exited exit the car. the car keeping his hands up and then laid down on the road in the prone position and remained there until Officer Jeffers arrived and secured in handcuffs. We then assisted to his feet to search him and found no items of interest. briefly sat on a curb while Officer Jeffers spoke to him, and then was seated in a squad car to keep warm.

Officer Ruff and I searched the BMW and again found no items of interest as other officers cleared the residence at **second second**. While clearing this residence, officers located the home owners and determined that the female had snuck out of the house without her parents permission. Officer Jeffers spoke separately to the three individuals that were detained from the car and they also had the same story that they came to pick up the female. We then released the three individuals that we had detained.

I responded to the scene from the north. I parked my squad car on Stone Creek facing south towards Stricker. I exited my squad car and began walking south along the east side of Stricker with Sgt. McNaught. It was called out over the radio that the suspect vehicle was leaving the scene at a extremely high rate of speed heading towards my location.

I observed the vehicle to be traveling at an extremely high rate of speed with only its parking lights activated. The roadway was dark and there were officers on foot in the area along with several squad cars parked tactically with no exterior lights on.

I removed my pistol from its holster and a flashlight. I shinned the light at the vehicle and pointed my pistol at it while yelling verbal commands to stop. The vehicle stopped in the middle of the roadway. Sgt. McNaught approached the vehicle from the passenger side rear side. I moved in front of the vehicle and observed an unknown number of occupants. As I approached closer the vehicle lunged forward towards me. I jumped onto the hood of the vehicle using my pistol to cushion my fall striking my pistol on the windshield. I landed on the vehicle laying on my stomach.

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support hand I opened the driver's door and pulled the driver out. I ordered the driver to the ground with his hands out to his side. I then pulled the driver's seat forwards and pulled the rear passenger out of the vehicle and ordered her to the ground with her hands to her side.

It was at that time I noticed my pistol was inoperable due to the impact. I was later able to make my pistol operational.

I stood by while all three occupants of the vehicle were handcuffed and placed in squad cars. I assisted Sgt. McNaught in conducting a search of the suspect vehicle. I found no contraband inside the vehicle.

I then went to ______ to speak with the reporting person, ______, DOB _____.

began by informing me that two years ago her neighbor across the street was burglarized and since that time all neighbors look out for each other. I heard loud thumping that woke her from her sleep. I looked outside and saw a black vehicle parked in front of I. The loud thumping was coming from the vehicle's stereo system. The vehicle was running and its headlights were on. I saw a black male dressed in black clothing standing in the driveway of I. Said this behavior is unusual in this neighborhood, especially during this time of night.

said the male walked around the house then walked back to the vehicle. The male then returned to the house near the garage door. believed the residents were gone on vacation and that no visitors were expected. I then called the police to report the activity. said she saw officers approach the vehicle then the vehicle accelerated rapidly and left the area at an extremely high rate of speed. could not provide any further information at this time.

When I returned to the location where the suspect vehicle was stopped I

On 12/25/2018 at 2351 hours, Officers were dispatched to for a burglary. METCAD advised the RP said she thought her neighbors were getting robbed. The RP stated 2 subjects in all black and one appeared to exit the house and the vehicle was parked in the street running.

Officers arrived and radioed they attempted to get out with the vehicle but it took off north bound. A very short time later they radioed they had the vehicle stopped and they needed assistance.

I arrived on scene I saw a male laying on the ground on the passenger side of the vehicle. Officer Ruff asked me to place the male, later identified as **Manual Control**, one of the passengers into hand cuffs. Sergeant McNaught and I placed **Manual** into handcuffs and checked them for proper fit, double locked them, searched his person for weapons or contraband, and nothing was located. I then assisted **Manual** off the ground and transported him to my squad car.

while other officers searched the residence. At I stood by with 0003 hours, I read the Juvenile Miranda Warnings, asked him if he understood and wanted to talk to me, said "Yes". I asked what occurred prior to police arrival. stated he was with his friend and they went over to their friends, , house to see her. told me they parked by house and she came outside and was hanging out with them inside the vehicle. said they were all talking in vehicle and they saw a group of people all dressed in black walking towards the vehicle. said he told to drive away because they feared the people walking towards them. said when they pulled away they did not know it was the police and when they finally saw the police cars they put it together that the people walking towards them was the police and they stopped the vehicle and complied with the orders. officer's initials JJ approved (UU1806270 - #A1816214) JEFFERS, JOSHUA D

I then spoke to **see** and asked her what occurred prior to police arrival. stated **stated** contacted her by text message and said he was in town and wanted to hang out with her. **See** told me when **stated** arrived she went out to the vehicle and they were all hanging out and talking inside the vehicle. **Stated** they saw the people dressed in black walking at them and they all feared for their safety and **stated** pulled the vehicle away to get away from them. **See** also stated they did not know it was the police and when they figured it out **stopped** the vehicle.

I spoke to **solution** and he told me **solution** wanted a ride to **solution** house so he could see her while he was in town. **Solution** told me when they arrived **solution** came out to his vehicle and they were all talking. **Solution** also said he saw the people dressed in black and everyone in the vehicle was scared so he pulled away for their safety. **Solution** also stated at first he did not know it was the police and when he realized it he stopped the vehicle and followed their commands.

The other officers checked the residence and found out there was not a burglary that occurred and the lived at the residence.

On 12/26/2018 at approximately 0004 hours, I responded to **Example**. Officer Gardner was standing by at the back door of the garage of this residence after a reported burglary in progress had been reported.

Officer Ruff and other Urbana Police Officers had stopped several subjects leaving the residence as they were responding to the area

When I arrived I met with Officer Gardner on the north west corner of the residence where the door leading into the garage was standing open. Officer Gardner, Officer Franquemont, Officer Tran of the University of Illinois Police Department, and Officer Osterholt of the University of Illinois Police Department began searching the residence.

I removed my pistol from my holster and used a ballistic shield to begin clearing the residence. Officer Gardner and Officer Franquemont began clearing a portion of the living room while I held a position of the stairway leading to the second floor of the residence. As we began searching the residence we called out to anyone inside and identified ourselves as Urbana Police Officers.

While I was maintaining my position, Officer Gardner made contact with a female, identified as the resident **formation**. **Solution** explained that the only people that should be in her residence are her three children and her husband. **Solution** explained that her husband was asleep in the first bedroom at the top of the stairs. I put my weapon in my holster and went to the top of the stairs. I located **formation** husband and two sons. I found that the bedroom which belonged to **formation** daughter **formation** was empty. I relayed this information to Officer Gardner who established that **formation** was in the vehicle that had been stopped.

During the time I was searching the residence, my pistol was not pointed MCKINNEY MATTHEW officer's initials MY approved (UU1806270-#A1816568) at any people in the residence. After it was determined that the incident was a juvenile problem and that no burglary had occurred I left the residence and cleared the call.

U18-6270 (2) The purpose of this report is to clarify certain details of this incident.

I responded to the scene from the north. I parked my squad car on Stone Creek facing south towards Stricker. I exited my squad and left it parked on Stone Creek with no exterior lights activated. Prior to exiting I did activate my in car camera and microphone system. I proceeded south along the east side of Stricker with Sgt. McNaught. I heard over my portable radio that the reporting person observed subjects running from the residence and get into a vehicle that was parked on Stricker. The vehicle's headlights were turned on. The vehicle proceeded to drive at an extremely high rate of speed heading north of Stricker.

I pointed my flashlight at the vehicle. My flashlight was in my left hand and my pistol was in my right. As the vehicle slowed to a stop I ran up to the passenger's side front quarter panel. As I approached the vehicle it appeared to move forward. My momentum carried me forward into the vehicle as I was unable to stop. I braced myself with both hands to prevent falling head first into the windshield. I was still carrying my flashlight and pistol so in bracing myself my flashlight and pistol, along with my shoulder and elbow struck the windshield causing damage. I was bent over at the waist so just my torso lay on the hood.

I moved along the front of the vehicle and ordered the driver out. The driver did not comply with my verbal commands. Sgt. McNaught was positioned on the passenger side of the vehicle. I attempted to open the RUFF, ERICL officer's initials approved 2000 (UU1806270-#A1816564)

driver side door but it was locked. I attempted to holster my pistol then open the door. When my pistol would not go into the holster I looked at my pistol and realized it had been damaged. The slide of my pistol was forced off the lower receiver in such a way it could not be repaired on scene. I knew there was a round in the chamber so the pistol was not safe. I held my pistol in my right hand and ordered the male driver out

of the vehicle and onto the ground. I then ordered the female back passenger out of the vehicle and onto the ground. I was very vocal and projected my voice with a command presence.

Once the two occupants were out of the vehicle and Sgt. McNaught took the third passenger in custody the volume and tone of my voice deescalated. I gave clear concise verbal commands to both male and female to remain on the ground and not to move their hands until other officers arrived. It was unknown at the time of the stop if the occupants of the vehicle were armed.

Sgt. Mikalik arrived on scene to secure the male and female laying on the ground. I advised Sgt. McNaught my pistol had been damaged. I took a knee next to the suspect's vehicle and attempted to make my pistol safe. I was unable to repair my pistol on sight.

Due to the distance I was from my squad car the audio recording was not totally clear. It can be heard on my audio recording the sound of me attempting to work the action of my pistol in order make it safe. It can also be heard me reporting to my supervisor that I partially fell into the vehicle's windshield causing damage to the windshield as well as my pistol.

I was unable to make my pistol safe on scene. I secured my pistol inside my squad car and drove to the reporting person's residence. 
