Chief Cobb:

I want to bring to your attention the excellent response of three Champaign Police officers on Thursday evening April 5, 2018. The officers I spoke with were Sgt. Brandon Thomas #904, Officer Doug Bluhm #742, and Officer Tim Frye #724.

For several years I have dealt with the growing physical and mental problems of my younger sister. She has refused to follow directions of doctors from all the local hospitals and the Veterans' Hospital in Danville, Illinois.

Last Thursday evening, during a phone call to the VA hospital, she apparently made comments suggesting a suicide. The hospital, as required, called METCAD and patrol cars were dispatched. When I arrived the officers and two ambulance attendants were already there. Many elderly residents of [REDACTED] were out of their apartments, obviously upset.

I told the officers I no longer held power of attorney for her health care and believed my presence in the apartment may further agitate the situation. Sgt. Thomas assured me she had already made statements that would allow for involuntary commitment for observation.

The officers and ambulance personnel were able to transport. The officers were very courteous, even though she was not and handled the situation in exemplary manner. While I thanked all three and voiced my gratitude, I believe they deserve a bit more recognition for a job well done!

We are grateful for the impact Officer Cowan has had on the culture and climate of our school. We are honored to have him as a part of our team.



For the past two weeks, my friend had been experiencing some sort of dementia, and he had been wandering the state hitchhiking and living in homeless shelters. Yesterday, he called me on the telephone from a truckstop in Bloomington and asked me for my help. After some coaxing, I was able to convince him to ride with me to the Champaign Police Department.

Officers Holloway and Fisher were exemplary. They patiently listened to him for hours, and respectfully insisted that he go with paramedics to Carle Hospital. They sent an officer to the hospital with him, and worked with my friend's concerned family to help make sure that he was admitted and could not leave or hurt himself. It is likely that your officer's actions helped to save this man from serious injury or death.

I understand that Saturday evenings are not the easiest shift for your department, and that there certainly had to be other pressing calls that you had to cover. The professionalism and care shown on the part of everybody working at the station last night made me very proud to call Champaign my home. This is a two part story that involves both Officer Halloway (sp) and Officer Hagemann(sp). On Halloween (10/31) of 2017 Officer Halloway responded to a call in our neighborhood that wasn't a big deal. While in the neighborhood he did some 'reverse trick or treating'. He spotted my young son sitting outside of our house waiting to give candy out and pulled up his cruiser in front of our house. He proceeded to ask my son some questions about himself and if he was having a good time. He thanked my son for giving out candy, reminded him to be safe and proceeded to give him a few pieces of candy. This, of course made my son's night and made us so appreciative of the work CDP does during the Holidays.

Fast forward to this past year on the day before Halloween (10/30/18) and officers were dispatched to our neighborhood again...sigh. This time, unfortunately, it was for a robbery (not my home). Many of us in the neighborhood were outside speaking with each other while officers were doing their work. It was toward the end of the situation that officer Halloway recognized me and the neighborhood and asked if we would be 'trick or treating again this year. We replied that we would be and I mentioned how much last year meant to my son. He told me that he or officer Hagemann would swing by to do it again.

I didn't tell my son that it would happen because I am knowledgeable enough to know that the work of a Police Officer is not predictable. We proceeded with Halloween as usual. Upon returning my son mentioned what happened the previous year and asked if he could do it again (give candy and see if a Police Officer would stop by). Needless to say, nobody showed and it was getting late. It wasn't but a few minutes after my son was in bed that Officer Hagemann showed up with sticker badges and candy for my boys. We invited him in and obliged. Needless to say my son was thrilled and we are in awe of that level of commitment to our community. We respect our officers and value the type of work that brings them into our neighborhoods as stewards of good will.

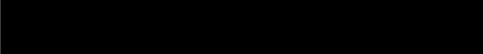

You were patient and professional, and when it did, in fact, turn out to be my mistake, you didn't offer a look or comment of irritation as most people, including myself, probably would have. I'm struggling in many ways at the moment and that was much appreciated. I think too often our contact with Law Enforcement comes in front of flashing lights - which isn't great, and it was nice to see another aspect. It admittedly won't change the world, but it makes it nicer.

I have a few family members in Law Enforcement - one with Champaign County, one retired from Rantoul and one retired from City of Chicago. I like to believe they would act in the same manner.
